What is the Order of the Eastern Star?

The Order of the Eastern Star is the largest fraternal organization to which both men and women belong.

What is the difference for membership in Freemasonry and the Order of the Eastern Star?

To join Freemasonry you need to be recommended by a brother and be of good moral character.

To join the Order of the Eastern Star, as a Mason, you must be a member in good standing. A woman must be of good moral character, but must also be related to a Master Mason in order to join.

This is why it is so important that Freemasonry and the Order of the Eastern Star work together to strengthen each organization.

Who are the members of the Order of the Eastern Star?

They are Master Masons in good standing, wives, or other female relatives of affiliated Master Masons in good standing, or if deceased were in good standing at the time of their death, as well as members—either active for three (3) years or majority—of the order of the International Order of the Rainbow for Girls or of the

International Order of Job's daughters, each of whom have attained at least the age of eighteen (18).

Did you know?

Dr. Robert Morris, the poet laureate of Freemasonry founded the Order of the Eastern Star. It was in 1850, while confined to his home following an accident that Morris wrote the initiatory Degrees of the order. He first initiated his wife and daughters and expanded to some neighbor ladies. The signs and modes of recognition given to them, he freely communicated to Masons so that they would be able to recognize the newly initiated women.

Robert McCoy who came onboard in 1860 and wrote the rituals of the order, as they exist today. These degrees centered on the lives of five biblical heroines, Adah, Ruth, Esther, Martha, and Electa with each one representing one of the five principles of the order, which are Fidelity, Constancy, Loyalty, Faith and Love.

What is our mission?
